## **ORDINANCE NO. 203**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF HYPOLUXO, FLORIDA, AMENDING ARTICLE VIII, "DOGS AND CATS," OF CHAPTER 22, "ENVIRONMENT," OF THE TOWN CODE OF ORDINANCES TO PROHIBIT THE RETAIL SALE OF DOGS AND CATS IN PET STORES AND REGULATE BREEDING ACTIVITIES WITHIN THE TOWN; AMENDING SECTION 22-176, "DEFINITIONS;" CREATING A NEW SECTION 22-180, "BREEDING AND RETAIL SALE OF DOGS AND CATS;" PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, according to the Human Society of the United States, hundreds of thousands of dogs and cats have been housed and bred at substandard breeding facilities, known as "puppy or kitten mills" that mass-produce animals for sale to the public, primarily at pet stores; and

WHEREAS, cats and dogs bred in puppy or kitten mills often suffer from health, social and/or temperament problems that sometimes result in costly treatment or death; and

WHEREAS, in addition to the congenital and hereditary conditions resulting from substandard breeding facilities, dogs and cats bred at these facilities may arrive in pet stores and their new homes with giardia, parvovirus and distemper, illnesses that can be transmitted to healthy animals; and

WHEREAS, while not all dogs and cats sold in retail pet stores are the product of inhumane breeding conditions and not every commercial breeder selling dogs or cats to pet stores operates a puppy or kitten mill, these facilities continue to exist in part because of public demand for the sale of dogs and cats in pet stores; and

**WHEREAS**, according to the Humane Society of the United States, Florida has the largest number of consumer complaints and the highest number of complaints about puppies purchased from pet stores; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council determines that prohibiting puppy and kitten mills and the retail sale of dogs and cats in pet stores located within the Town will promote community awareness of animal welfare and will encourage pet consumers to adopt dogs and cats from shelters, thereby saving the lives of animals and reducing the cost to the public of sheltering animals.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF HYPOLUXO as follows:

1 2	<b>Section 1.</b> The foregoing recitals are hereby ratified as true and correct and incorporated herein.
3 4 5 6	<b>Section 2.</b> The Town Council hereby amends Article VIII, "Dogs and Cats," of Chapter 22, "Environment," of the Town Code of Ordinances to read as follows (additional language <u>underlined</u> ):

12	When used in this article, the following terms shall have the
13	meanings herein ascribed to them:

15	Animal rescue organization means a duly incorporated non-profit
16	organization devoted to the rescue, care and adoption of stray,
17	abandoned or surrendered animals and which does not breed animals.
18	Animal shelter means a public animal shelter or shelter operated by
19	an animal rescue organization.

22	At large shall mean that the dog is off the premises of the owner
23	and not on a leash or otherwise under the immediate control of a person
24	physically capable of restraining the dog.

26	Cat means an animal of the Felidae family of the order Carnivora.

28	Dog means an animal of the Canidae family of the order Carnivora.

30	Owner shall mean any person having temporary or permanent
31	custody of, sheltering or having charge of, harboring, exercising control
32	over, or having property rights to any dog or cat. A dog or cat shall be
33	deemed to be harbored if it is fed or sheltered for three or more
34	consecutive days.

36	Pet store means any retail establishment whether operated separately or in conjunction with another business enterprise open to the
37 38	public that sells or transfers, of offers for sale or transfer, dogs or cats
39	regardless of the age of the animal.

41	Puppy or kitten mill means a facility where dogs or cats are bred for
42	the purpose of selling them and where any two (2) of the following
43	conditions are found to exist:

45	(1) More than twenty (20) puppies under the age of twelve (12)
46	weeks or more than twenty kittens under the age of sixteen
47	(16) weeks are kent at a single time:

(b) No owner or custodian of any dog or cat shall permit any waste matter from the animal to collect and remain on the property of the owner or custodian, or on the property of others so as to cause or create an unhealthy, unsanitary, dangerous or offensive living condition on the owner's or custodian's property or to abutting property of others.

## Sec. 22-180. Breeding and retail sale of dogs and cats.

- (a) <u>Puppy or Kitten Mills.</u> It shall be unlawful for any person or entity to establish, operate or maintain a puppy or kitten mill within the corporate limits of the Town.
- (b) <u>Sale or transfer of dogs or cats</u>. It shall be unlawful for a pet store to display, sell, deliver, barter, lease, rent, auction, give away, transfer, offer for sale or transfer, or otherwise dispose of dogs or cats within the corporate limits of the Town.
  - (c) Exemptions. This section shall not apply to:
  - (1) A person who sells, deliver, offers for sale, trades, barters, leases, rents, auctions, gives away or otherwise transfers or disposes of a dog or cat that was bred and reared on property owned by the person provided that the person is not operating a puppy or kitten mill, the person is not a pet dealer as defined in chapter 828 F.S., and the property is not a pet store;
  - (2) An animal shelter;
  - (3) An animal rescue organization; or
  - (4) An animal shelter or animal rescue organization that operates out of or in conjunction with a pet store.
- (d) <u>Adoption of shelter and rescue animals</u>. Nothing in this section shall prevent a pet store or its owner, operator or employees from providing space and appropriate care for animals owned by or in the custody of an animal shelter or animal rescue organization and maintained at the pet store for the purpose of offering the animals for adoption by members of the public.
  - (e) Violations, enforcement.
  - (1) Code enforcement personnel are authorized to enforce this article in accordance with all remedies set forth in division 2 of article II of chapter 2 of this code.

1	<u>(2)</u>	Law enforcement personnel are authorized to enforce this					
2		article in accordance with all remedies set forth in division 2					
3		of article II of chapter 2 of this code, section 1-14 of this					
4		code, and any other provision of state or local law.

6	(3)	In addition to the remedies set forth above, whether civil or					
7	<del></del> -	criminal, the town may also pursue temporary or permanent					
8		injunctive relief or any other legal or equitable remedy					
9		authorized by law in a court of competent jurisdiction to					
10		enforce the provisions of this section.					
11							
12	Section 3.	The provisions of this Ordinance shall become and be made a part					
13	of the Code of the Town of Hypoluxo, Florida.						
14							
15	Section 4.	If any section, paragraph, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this					
16	Ordinance is for	any reason held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be					
17	unconstitutional, inoperative or void, such holding shall not affect the remainder of the						
18	Ordinance.						
19							
20	Section 5.	All ordinances or parts of ordinances and resolutions or parts of					
21	resolutions of the Town of Hypoluxo, Florida, which are in conflict with this Ordinance,						
22	are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.						
23							
24	Section 6.	This Ordinance shall be effective immediately upon adoption.
